



izamabad is the northwestern interior district of Telangana. Located 172 km from Hyderabad, it was the former capital of the Rashtrakutas and lies close to the Maharashtra border. It was formerly known as Induru after the Rashtrakuta King Indrudu. Nizamabad is a compact district with unusual sights to behold. The district boasts of over half a dozen temples, a picturesque Dargah, a couple of beautiful lakeside resorts, a dam and deep dark forests. The famous Qilla Ramalayam, is a temple built in a fort. It lies in the heart of Nizamabad and is a landmark by itself. Alisagar is a most popular weekend spot. The lush forest, a deer park a summer house, and boating on a lake make it an idyllic getaway. Ashok Sagar 7 km from Nizamabad alike Alisagar also has a rock garden. Dichpally Ramalayam, Banyan Tree, Armoor Rock Formations and Pochampad Project are some of the places worth visiting.





Alisagar

Alisagar is the beautiful garden developed by Nizam of Hyderabad. The Garden spreads across 33 acres, bedecked with fountains and a colorful profusion of flowering plants, It also has a Deer Park and an enchanting Tree House. There is a small island nestled in middle of the Alisagar lake. This beautiful nature spot is situated about 10km from Nizamabad town and 2kms off from the Nizamabad-Basar route. Alisagar is being developed as an amusement and eco-tourism destination.





on the eastern side is the Maha Kali temple. A 100 metres to the north of the temple is a cave known as the Narahari Maluka. It is believed that Veda Vyas, the author of the epic 'Mahabharatha' meditated here. The presence of divinity overwhelms and the ancient lore enthralls. Basara today is a thriving temple town where devotees throng to perform "Akshara Abhyasam" for their children. A pilgrimage with children to Basara for "Akshara Puja" before commencing formal school education, is said to be auspicious for their academic success.

Kawal Wildlife Sanctuary

If you are looking for adventure amidst wild and wonderful nature, Kawal Wildlife Sanctuary is just 15 kms away from Jannaram. You can check in at the resort plan a trip to the Sanctuary. Kawal Wildlife Sanctuary



covers an area of about 893 Sq. Kms and the forest here is rich with flora and fauna. The sanctuary in essentially a dry deciduous forest and all over the sanctuary you can find teak, bamboo, Terminalia which is a type of large flowering trees, and more uncommon varieties. When it comes to the animals, you can hope to spot a Tiger since it is a Tiger Reserve. The sanctuary is also home to Panthers, Gaur, Cheetah, Sambar, Nilgai, Barking Deer, Chowsingha, Mouse Deer, Sloth Bear and a large variety of birds and reptiles. Kawal Wildlife Sanctuary is also said to be one of the richest teak forests in Telangana.



Accessing

Air: Nearest Airport is Rajiv Gandhi International Airport at Hyderabad. 172 kms from Nizamabad

Rail: Nizamabad Railway Station (NZB) falls on the Kachiguda - Manmad line of the South Central Railway. It is connected with all the major towns and cities of the state. Thus, getting to the city by rail is no problem at all. From Hyderabad and Mumbai, there are regular trains for Nizamabad.

Road: The National Highway No. 7 moves through the periphery of the town, which connects all the cities on the way, from Kanyakumari to Varanasi. National Highway No. 16 also traverses through Nizamabad and links it with places like Karimnagar and Jagadalpur. The North South Corridor of NHDP also passes from here. There are regular bus services from Hyderabad and Mumbai to the town.
